	<u>A complaint investigation was conducted to determine if facility has a vermin infestation. Refer to complaints CO 59842, CO 59841, CO 59840, CO 59829 and video provided.</u>
	<u>NATURE OF COMPLAINT:</u>
	<u>Complainants allege that vermin have been observed at the restaurant and inside customer dining room.</u>
	<u>FINDINGS:</u>
	<u>Facility manager was interviewed and the following information was provided: (NOTE - facility manager, floor manager and chef present during inspection)</u>
	<u>• Managers were aware of complaints and were present during the incident.</u>
	<u>• Facility has implemented an abatement program to address <del>vermin</del> with Matrix Pest Elimination (Schedule will be emailed)</u>
	<u>• Operator provided invoices. Invoices stated the following (paraphrased):</u>
	<u>- 11/22/2022: Interior - found rodent droppings by coffee machine. Inspected tin cans and found one (1) mouse. Glue boards were replaced. No activity found. Exterior - Binfen applied. Exterior bait station bait replaced (light feeding observed)</u>
	<u>- 12/13/2022: Interior rodent glue boards replaced. Two (2) rats found on snap traps located in basement and in kitchen. Bait station bait replaced (heavy rodent feeding).</u>
	<u>• Pest control services facility once a month. More if needed. Will return tomorrow for another servicing of facility.</u>
	<u>• Operator indicated that rodent <del>problems</del> <sup>sightings</sup> have been more frequent due to the following reasons:</u>
	<u>- Heavy rain (on the day of incident)</u>
	<u>- Homeless encampment below facility out door patio.</u>
	<u>- Recent cutting of landscape shrubbery around facility and roof.</u>

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- Next Matrix appointment was made for tomorrow to determine any more subsequent appointments.
• Operator indicated that maintenance staff will come tomorrow to address all violations noted today.
• Operator provided inspector with notice that is being issued to their customers and posted on their website.

OBSERVATIONS

- NO LIVE OR DEAD rodents observed on this day
• Four (4) violations found on this day
- Violation # 22: Observed fresh vermin droppings, on top of dry storage bins located next to open rear delivery door. (see violation 33 and 43).
Observed old vermin droppings on shelves and partition under bar table (bar tending side).
Observed old vermin droppings inside employee storage room, behind entry maintained station.
(All droppings were scattered and no more than 10 small droppings observed at one).

\*Eliminate all evidence of rodent activity and ensure all contaminated surfaces have been cleaned and sanitized.

- A reinspection will be conducted to ensure the following conditions are met:
1 Pest control program shall be provided with proof that rodent activity has been alleviated
2 Provide detail receipt of most recent service indicating the following:
a) the target pest b) chemicals/equipment used c) the target areas d) findings e) Notes if any.
3 Thorough cleaning of affected areas (NO DEAD OR LIVE RODENTS SHALL BE SEEN ON DAY of re-inspection)
4 Seal, cover, repair all holes, crevices and gaps on floors, walls & ceiling.

The numbers listed before each violation correspond to the violation data field/corrective action number, which can be found on the back of the inspection report.

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Violation #33: Lids on the flour, rice/dry bulk food containers had ~10 fresh vermin droppings

\*Ensure all nonfood contact surfaces are clean and maintained in sanitary condition. Clean/sanitize maintain dropping free.

Violation #43: Observed the following vermin-proofing deficiencies:

- 1. Rear delivery door was maintained open throughout inspection
\* Maintain doors closed to prevent vermin entry
2. Observed various gaps, holes and spaces big enough for vermin entry throughout facility
\* Seal and eliminate all gaps, cracks, holes, and crevices under doors, on walls, floors, and exterior spaces.

\* Food facility shall be constructed, equipped and maintained in a manner that prevents the entrance or harborage of animals or vermin including but not limited to insects and rodents.

3. Observed minor food debris around dumpsters. Maintain clean and inside dumpsters.

Violation # 36: Observed old/non-operational equipment (cast offs) stored by dumpsters.

- Remove all misc./cast offs/non-operational equipment from facility to prevent harboring of vermin.

RESULTS:

Fresh droppings were observed and confirmed in the facility. Mitigating programs were discussed.

Managers have been informed and educated on safe food utensils, food disposal, and general sanitary/vermin proofing procedure to conduct to eliminate vermin/pest throughout facility.

HEALTH PERMIT TO THIS FACILITY HAS BEEN SUSPENDED DUE TO A VERMIN INFESTATION EVIDENCE. Evidence by fresh droppings could result in contamination of food equipment, packing, and/or utensils.

Facility must remain closed for business until a re-inspection is conducted and the health permit to operate is reinstated by this agency. When ready to open contact your inspector.

If facility is found to not be in compliance during re-inspection, a charged follow-up will occur.

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
